February Meeting – Organ Concert by Kirk Rich, First Presbyterian, Evansville. Sunday, February 21, 2016, 4:00 PM.

The chapter is delighted to welcome former Evansville resident and award-winning organist **Kirk M. Rich**. His program on C. B. Fisk Op. 98 is sure to be a thrilling and memorable event! Mark your calendars now, and don't forget to invite your friends and colleagues to attend. A reception sponsored by the chapter will follow the concert.

Kirk is a laureate of several organ competitions. In June 2014, he was a finalist in the AGO's National Young Artists' Competition in Organ Performance, performing at the National



AGO Convention in Boston at Harvard University's Memorial Church. Kirk has been accepted as a semifinalist in the 2016 NYACOP, where he will compete in Dallas, Texas in June. Most recently, Kirk took first prize and prize for hymn playing excellence at the 44th Annual William C. Hall Pipe Organ Competition (graduate division) in San Antonio.

Kirk began organ study in Evansville, studying with Douglas Reed through high school. Kirk holds a Bachelor of Music degree from the Oberlin College Conservatory of Music where he studied organ with James David Christie and harpsichord with Webb Wiggins. He has played in masterclasses for Marie-Claire Alain, David Briggs, Francesco Cera, Hans-Ola Ericsson, and Olivier Latry, among many others. An interest in technique and ease in playing led to certification in the Lister-Sink Method of Well-Coordinated, Injury-Preventive Keyboard Technique at Salem College, where Kirk studied piano with Barbara Lister-Sink. He obtained the Master of Music degree from Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, studying organ with Christopher Young, harpsichord with Elisabeth Wright, and improvisation with Bruce Neswick. Currently, Kirk is a doctoral student at the University of Houston Moores School of Music where he studies organ with Robert Bates, harpsichord with Matthew Dirst, and choral conducting with Betsy Cook Weber. He is the Organist and Associate for Music Ministries at Grace Presbyterian Church in Houston.
